#### A recent TIB analysis has delved into affidavits of the national election candidates, unearthing a startling trend of escalating wealth among politicians and their dependents. This concerning pattern has pervaded the political landscape over the past decade, as highlighted in the report titled 'Interpreting Election Affidavit Data: What Message Does It Convey to the Public?' The report

underscores inadequacy of the regulatory bodies addressing concerned in overseeing and disproportionate accumulation of wealth. Subsequently, TIB has urged proactive actions from the Election Commission (EC), the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC), and the National Board of Revenue (NBR) to investigate and authenticate the affidavit data. In another proactive move, TIB has introduced the interactive Know Your Candidate (KYC) dashboard. This citizens

user-friendly platform empowers stakeholders to evaluate candidates' data, contributing to enhanced election transparency.
