Recent attacks on journalists: TIB expresses its concern and demands justice

TIB has expressed its concern and disappointment over the recent incidents of assaults on journalists by the law enforcing agencies. In a statement it strongly condemned the assault by the police upon on-duty media professional at an event on 26 May in Dhaka Women's Polytechnic Institute. Iftekharuzzaman, Executive Director of TIB said, "We demand exemplary punishment of the perpetrators. Temporary suspensions are not enough." Such unruly conduct is not only detrimental to media freedom, but also absolutely undemocratic and unconstitutional, he added.

In this context, TIB also expressed deep concern over the growing evidences of excessive abuse of power by the police and RAB which may eventually convert the law enforcers into law breakers. Failure of these agencies and the government to control such unconstitutional and undemocratic trends will erode public trust upon them and tarnish the credibility of the government.

"We are also concerned that conduct of law enforcing agencies often bears evidence of partisan political influence. We call upon the authorities to attach highest priority to building the ethical and professional standards of them and create environment where they can function without partisan political influence," the statement said.



TIB mourns the death of Professor Muzaffer Ahmad

Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) deeply mourns the sad demise of its former Chairman and member of the Trustee Board Professor Muzaffer Ahmad who passed away on 22 May 2012. TIB family - Board, staff, CCC, YES, Shojon, YES Friends are deeply shocked and bereaved and recall with highest sense of gratitude his contribution to the Anti-corruption movement in Bangladesh.

In a message, TIB Executive Director Dr. Iftekharuzzaman termed Professor Muzaffer Ahmad as an

irreplaceable voice for rights of all people, justice, democracy and good governance. "The Anticorruption movement in Bangladesh will remain grateful to him forever," he said and added that his powerful, fearless and straightforward stance



on matters of interest to TIB and beyond were the source of inspiration for all of us. "I particularly recall his contribution to the conceptual premise of all that TIB has done so far, does today, and will do in the days to come. His research guidance and supervision always made us confident and strong," TIB Executive Director further said.

Born in Kolkata on March 27, 1936, Professor Muzaffer Ahmad leaves behind his wife, two sons and a daughter. In his long career as an economist, teacher, social and environmental activist, he remained

active in establishing good governance, raising a social movement against corruption and preventing degradation of the environment. He penned a number of books and articles at home and abroad.

RAJUK's MoU with the Sahara Group: TIB demands transparency

Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) demanded from Rajuk (CapitalDevelopment Authority) and the Government full disclosure of the contents of the Memorandum of Understanding signed between Rajuk and the Sahara Group of India for investment in a proposed low?cost housing project around the capital Dhaka, and of the relevant decision making process. In a statement it though welcomed Rajuk's initiative to build housing facilities for the low?income households around Dhaka city but said any decision regarding the use and exploitation of land must be transparent and consistent with the relevant laws and regulations. TIB also

demanded that the concerned authorities should give importance to the process in which a particular company had been selected and offered the opportunity. It also asked to review whether the decision was consistent with the relevant procurement law and rules and whether capable, credible and interested companies/investors of national origin had been, or would be offered, the similar opportunity on equal footing. It further demanded that the whole decision?making process should be subject to open and fully competitive process without bias or favour to anyone.
