CAG needs to be autonomous: TIB

The separation of the Controller General of Accounts office (CGA) from the Office of Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG), without amending the constitution, has allowed only the Ministry of Finance to give instructions to the CGA office, leading to a lack of transparency & accountability of CGA activities. TIB placed some specific recommendations to overcome the limitations of a study "Challenge of Good Governance at CGA Office and the Way Out". Dipu Roy, one of the researchers of TIB, presented the summary of the study findings at a roundtable at CIRDAP auditorium where and Dr. Iftekharuzzaman, the Executive Director of TIB moderated the session.

Advocate Sultana Kamal, Chairperson of the TIB's Board of Trustees, presided and Finance Minister AMA Muhith was present as chief guest. The Finance Minister agreed with the findings of the study and made recommendations to follow the accrual method. Ahmed Ataul Hakim, CAG as a special guest urged for the enactment of an audit law as soon as possible.

held in Rangpur and `Rangamati Some of the recommendations included: enact a code of conduct for the employees of CGA, ensure punishment against proven acts of corruption, appoint an ombudsman to ensure that the allegations of corruption against any employee can be accounted for, reveal assets of staff and employee, introduce accrual method gradually, redesign existing organogram, improve professional skills, and strengthen monitoring systems.

TIB concerned over the attack on Limon by Rapid Action Battalion (RAB) source

TIB was deeply concerned over the attack on Limon Hossain by a RAB source and demanded exemplary punishment against those responsible for this attack. TIB also expressed concern over Rajapur Police's final report which acquitted the RAB members for any involvement on Limon's attack, terming it an example of the law enforcing agency's shameless failure and abuse of power.

Limon, a college student of Jhalokathi was shot in the leg by RAB on March 23, 2011. TIB demanded a neutral and credible judicial probe into the whole incident. TIB also requested Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to intervene personally for ensuring security of Limon and his family, along with paying compensation.

The Executive Director of TIB Dr. Iftekharuzzaman said, "The way law enforcing agency members destroyed Limon's career shocked the public. A drama is being staged to save the main culprits, which is a big threat to democratic practice and the rule of law."

TIB expressed concern over the embezzlement of thousands of crore taka through Sonali Bank and demanded exemplary punishment through an independent, impartial and influence-free investigation.

On August Dr. Iftekharuzzaman, Executive Director of TIB in a statement said, "such incident involving state-owned commercial bank reflects a poor financial monitoring and management system that allowed misuse of funds in connivance with politically-influential persons, which is an alarming sign of state capture by the corrupt." The conflicting positions of Bangladesh Bank and the Finance Minister created



confusion in public minds regarding government's ability to conduct a proper investigation, and will also contribute in slowing the whole banking and financial sector reeling under absence of any accountability and good governance.
